

 - Reduce the Complexity of FEMA



House of Worship/Faith Community Emergency Planning Principles

- Planning considers all threats and hazards
- Planning considers all setting and all times
- Planning provides for the access and functional needs of the whole house of worship community
- A model EOP is created by following a collaborative process

 - Understand the unique needs of your community
 - Access and Functional Needs
 - Children
 - Pets and Animals
 - Historical Artifacts and Buildings




General Planning Fundamentals

- Planning needs to include input from all stakeholders
 - Emergency Management Director (EMD) & First Responders
- Plans must consider all threats and hazards

 Plans need to be flexible and scalable to address both the minor and the catastrophic


The 6-Step Planning Process

Incident

Identify and train a spokesperson

Coordinate a public information message with stakeholders

Disseminate information to employees and guests

Notice of resolution and facility status

Assistance notification and accountability

Control rumors, community restoration



Effective Notification Message

Immediate

Rapid implementation

Receivable

At or away from work station

• By persons who may have impairments

Understandable

Clear and concise

To persons who may not speak English

Credible

Delivered from trusted sender



Drafting and Reviewing the Plan

Best writing practices

- Use simple language
- Use short, active voice sentences
- Give enough detail to convey easily understood, actionable guidance
- Focus on mission guidance

Plan review criteria

- Adequacy
- Feasibility
- Acceptability
- Completeness
- Compliancy
